⁶ Seek the LORD and live, or he will break out against the house of Joseph like fire, and it will devour Bethel, with no one to quench it.

⁷ Ah, you that turn justice to wormwood, and bring righteousness to the ground!..

¹⁰ They hate the one who reproves in the gate, and they abhor the one who speaks the truth.

¹¹ Therefore, because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them; you have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine.

¹² For I know how many are your transgressions, and how great are your sins—you who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and push aside the needy in the gate.

¹³ Therefore the prudent will keep silent in such a time; for it is an evil time.

¹⁴ Seek good and not evil, that you may live; and so the Lord, the God of hosts, will be with you, just as you have said.

¹⁵ Hate evil and love good, and establish justice in the gate; it may be that the Lord, the God of hosts, will be gracious to the remnant of Joseph.

GOSPEL: John 4: 31 - 42

³¹ Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, 'Rabbi, eat something.' ³² But he said to them, 'I have food to eat that you do not know about.'

³³ So the disciples said to one another, 'Surely no one has brought him something to eat?'

³⁴ Jesus said to them, 'My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to complete his work. ³⁵ Do you not say, "Four months more, then comes the harvest"? But I tell you, look

around you, and see how the fields are ripe for harvesting. ³⁶ The reaper is already

receiving^[a] wages and is gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may

rejoice together. ³⁷ For here the saying holds true, "One sows and another reaps." ³⁸ I sent

you to reap that for which you did not labour. Others have laboured, and you have entered

into their labour.' ³⁹ Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the

woman's testimony, 'He told me everything I have ever done.' ⁴⁰ So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with

them; and he stayed there for two days. ⁴¹ And many more believed because of his word.

⁴² They said to the woman, 'It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Saviour of the world.'
