⁶ Come back to the LORD and live!

Otherwise, he will roar through Israel like a fire,
devouring you completely.

Your gods in Bethel

won't be able to quench the flames.

⁷ You twist justice, making it a bitter pill for the
oppressed.

You treat the righteous like dirt.

¹⁰ How you hate honest judges!

How you despise people who tell the truth!

¹¹ You trample the poor,

stealing their grain through taxes and unfair
rent.

Therefore, though you build beautiful stone
houses,

you will never live in them.

Though you plant lush vineyards,

you will never drink wine from them.

¹² For I know the vast number of your sins
and the depth of your rebellions.

You oppress good people by taking bribes
and deprive the poor of justice in the courts.

¹³ So those who are smart keep their mouths shut,
for it is an evil time.

¹⁴ Do what is good and run from evil
so that you may live!

Then the LORD God of Heaven's Armies will be
your helper,

just as you have claimed.

¹⁵ Hate evil and love what is good;

turn your courts into true halls of justice.

Perhaps even yet the LORD God of Heaven's
Armies

will have mercy on the remnant of his people.



GOSPEL: Mark 10: 17—31 (NLT)

¹⁷ As Jesus was starting out on his way to
Jerusalem, a man came running up to him, knelt
down, and asked, "Good Teacher, what must I
do to inherit eternal life?"

¹⁸ "Why do you call me good?" Jesus asked. "Only
God is truly good. ¹⁹ But to answer your

question, you know the commandments: 'You
must not murder. You must not commit
adultery. You must not steal. You must not
testify falsely. You must not cheat anyone.
Honor your father and mother.'"

²⁰ "Teacher," the man replied, "I've obeyed all
these commandments since I was young."

²¹ Looking at the man, Jesus felt genuine love for
him. "There is still one thing you haven't
done," he told him. "Go and sell all your
possessions and give the money to the poor, and
you will have treasure in heaven. Then come,
follow me."

²² At this the man's face fell, and he went away
sad, for he had many possessions.

²³ Jesus looked around and said to his
disciples, "How hard it is for the rich to enter
the Kingdom of God!" ²⁴ This amazed them. But
Jesus said again, "Dear children, it is very hard to
enter the Kingdom of God. ²⁵ In fact, it is easier
for a camel to go through the eye of a needle
than for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of
God!"

²⁶ The disciples were astounded. "Then who in
the world can be saved?" they asked.

²⁷ Jesus looked at them intently and
said, "Humanly speaking, it is impossible. But not
with God. Everything is possible with God."

²⁸ Then Peter began to speak up. "We've given
up everything to follow you," he said.

²⁹ "Yes," Jesus replied, "and I assure you that
everyone who has given up house or brothers
or sisters or mother or father or children or
property, for my sake and for the Good
News, ³⁰ will receive now in return a hundred
times as many houses, brothers, sisters,
mothers, children, and property—along with
persecution. And in the world to come that
person will have eternal life. ³¹ But many who are
the greatest now will be least important then,
and those who seem least important now will be
the greatest then."
