OT: Job 42: 1—6, 10—end (NLT)

Then Job replied to the LORD:

² “I know that you can do anything,
and no one can stop you.

³ You asked, ‘Who is this that questions
my wisdom with such ignorance?’

It is I—and I was talking about things I
knew nothing about,
things far too wonderful for me.

⁴ You said, ‘Listen and I will speak!

I have some questions for you,
and you must answer them.’

⁵ I had only heard about you before,
but now I have seen you with my own
eyes.

⁶ I take back everything I said,
and I sit in dust and ashes to show my
repentance.”

¹⁰ When Job prayed for his friends,
the LORD restored his fortunes. In fact,
the LORD gave him twice as much as
before! ¹¹ Then all his brothers, sisters,
and former friends came and feasted
with him in his home. And they consoled
him and comforted him because of all
the trials the LORD had brought against
him. And each of them brought him a gift
of money^[a] and a gold ring.

¹² So the LORD blessed Job in the second
half of his life even more than in the
beginning. For now he had 14,000 sheep,
6,000 camels, 1,000 teams of oxen, and
1,000 female donkeys. ¹³ He also gave Job
seven more sons and three more
daughters. ¹⁴ He named his first daughter
Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the

third Keren-happuch. ¹⁵ In all the land no
women were as lovely as the daughters
of Job. And their father put them into his
will along with their brothers.

¹⁶ Job lived 140 years after that, living to
see four generations of his children and
grandchildren.



GOSPEL: Mark 10: 46—end (NLT)

⁴⁶ Then they reached Jericho, and as Jesus
and his disciples left town, a large crowd
followed him. A blind beggar named
Bartimaeus (son of Timaeus) was sitting
beside the road. ⁴⁷ When Bartimaeus
heard that Jesus of Nazareth was nearby,
he began to shout, “Jesus, Son of David,
have mercy on me!”

⁴⁸ “Be quiet!” many of the people yelled at
him.

But he only shouted louder, “Son of David,
have mercy on me!”

⁴⁹ When Jesus heard him, he stopped and
said, “Tell him to come here.”

So they called the blind man. “Cheer up,”
they said. “Come on, he’s calling
you!” ⁵⁰ Bartimaeus threw aside his coat,
jumped up, and came to Jesus.

⁵¹ “What do you want me to do for
you?” Jesus asked.

“My Rabbi,” the blind man said, “I want to
see!”

⁵² And Jesus said to him, “Go, for your faith
has healed you.” Instantly the man could
see, and he followed Jesus down the road.
